

North Coast Squid Submission Guidelines

Overall Goal of the North Coast Squid: The North Coast Squid literary journal provides artists and artists with a North Oregon Coast Connection an opportunity to see their work in print. We seek writing and artwork that is well-crafted, in a diversity of mediums and of interesting subject matter. The Squid is published in odd-numbered years.

Specific requirements for the submissions:

Poetry

- Up to three poems, with the title as the file name for each one
- No more than 90 lines (including stanza breaks)
- 12-point font, single-spaced, one-inch margins (if formatting is critical to the poetry submission, send a pdf file. However we cannot accommodate requests for type style/size or additional spaces between lines)
- · No name or identification on the documents
- Previously unpublished

Fiction and Nonfiction

- One fiction and/or nonfiction piece, up to 1,500 words in length
- Word or .txt file, page numbered, double-spaced, 12-point font, one-inch margins
- Use the title as the file name.
- No name of identification on the documents
- Editorial team takes no responsibility for correcting spelling or grammar, please proof your work before submission. Too many errors may disqualify the piece.

Art

- Up to three pieces of art, with the title as the file name for each one
- Work can be 2-D or photographs of 3-D in any medium.
- Pieces previously displayed at the Hoffman Center will not be accepted.
- Photographs and scanned art must be in .jpg or .jpeg format. To ensure high-resolution publishable images, the file size should be at least 1MB (and 3MB if you wish the piece to be considered for the cover).

Note: only a small number of color pieces can be accepted. Color images with a "portrait" orientation may be considered for the cover of the magazine. Most art

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within the publication will be black and white—artist are encouraged to convert images themselves. The editorial team may choose to convert a color submission to black and white, unless expressly prohibited by the artist.

Who Can Submit:

- Artists and writers with a connection to the Northern Oregon coast: either as a full-time, part-time, or former resident of Clatsop or Tillamook County; or as a frequent visitor.
- Visiting artists who lead Hoffman workshops or demos
- The biographical statement must be under 50 words and clearly indicate the author's connection to the North Oregon Coast.

How to Submit:

- All work must be submitted electronically, along with the submission fee.
- Non-compliance with requirements may result in the pieces being declined
- Submission fees help support submission management.

Who Makes the Decision:

- The writing is selected by NW published authors from outside the North Oregon Coastal community.
- Art is selected by the editorial team, including members of the Hoffman Gallery.

What Submitters Can Expect

- Writers and Artists will be notified by email approximately six weeks after the end of the submission period.
- The North Coast Squid is released and distributed to coastal retailers approximately ten weeks after submissions are accepted.
- Writers are invited to participate in the release event on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Artists are invited to submit the original of their published work (ready-to-hang/display) in the Hoffman Gallery for the month of the release.
